 - Since the HVIP > VW, use VW funds award to our upcoming order of five BEBs, since we have not yet locked down HVIP funds for those e-buses.



- Unaudited operating & financial results FY22-23 at 58.3% of the fiscal year on B-1-5
- RTA fixed-route ridership increased 11.9% over last year
- Runabout ridership increased 26%
- Past five years of ridership and productivity trends are on graphs B-1-10



- Operating costs for the fiscal year:
 - Slightly below budget at 53.3 % of budget for noncapital expenses at 58.3% of the fiscal year
 - Labor-Operations is largest line-item at 86.5%
 - Due to lower service levels
 - Fuel steady price increase— over by 21.3%
 - \$120,000+ over YTD budget
 - Prices have declined in December but remain volatile



- Farebox Recovery Ratio
 - Fixed-Route 8.8%
 - Runabout 2.4%
- Subsidy per passenger is improving
 - Fixed-Route \$15.68— was \$15.72 in FY20-21
 - Runabout \$128.14 was \$133 in FY20-21

ICT Rollout Plan

- Regulation was adopted by CARB in December
 2018
 - Requires all CA public transit agencies to transition to a 100-percent zero-emission bus fleet by 2040
 - Small transit agencies must submit its governing bodyapproved ICT ZEB Rollout Plan to the CARB Executive Officer by July 1, 2023



ICT Rollout Plan

- Describes how a transit agency is planning to achieve a full transition by 2040
- Must include nine components:
 - A. Transit Agency Information
 - B. Rollout Plan General Information
 - C. Technology Portfolio
 - D. Current Bus Fleet Composition and Future Bus Purchases
 - E. Facilities and Infrastructure Modifications
 - F. Providing Service in Disadvantaged Communities
 - G. Workforce Training
 - H. Potential Funding Sources
 - I. Start-up and Scale-up Challenges



Legislation & Regional Plans/Policies

- CARB ICT published December 2018
- RTA Zero-Emission Vehicle Purchase Policy adopted March 2019
- RTA Electrification-Readiness Plan and Deployment of Battery-Electric Buses presented April 2019
- SLOCOG Regional Zero Emissions Bus Implementation Plan adopted August 2020
- FTA Zero-Emission Transition Plan requirement published December 2021



Steps Taken Since January Draft

- Developed white paper on Hydrogen Fuel Cell Electric Bus technologies & potential application at the RTA (Appendix E)
- Addresses two areas required for the FTA Zero-Emission Transition Plan (Appendix F)
